Rahul mocks at govt over 3-year gala

NEW DELHI, MAY 16 /--/ Congress Vice President Rahul Gandhi today asked the BJP-led government at the Centre what it was celebrating after three years in power, as all it had to show for this time were "broken promises" and "non-performance". Pointing to farmer suicides and unemployment in the country, he said the last three years were a "betrayal" of the mandate the government had received. "Youth are struggling to find jobs, farmers are committing suicide & soldiers are dying at the border. What exactly is the Govt celebrating" Candhii tweeted. "3 years of broken promises, non performance & betrayal of a mandate," he said in another tweet. The BJP is organising a 'Modi Fest' across the country to mark three years of its rule at the Centre Modi, however, does not refer to the Prime Minister's name but stands for Making of Developing India. The festival will be kicked off by the prime Prime Minister's name but stands for Making of Develop-ing India. The festival will be kicked off by the prime minister with a series of events and a public meeting in Guwahati on May 26, and will conclude on June 15. The celebrations are planned to be held across the country and there will be at least one event in each district. Gan-dhi had earlier also attacked the government over job creation and had said it failed to deliver on its poll prom-ise of creating 1 crore jobs a year. Delhi HC transfers missing INU student case to CBI

NEW DELHI, MAY 18/-/ The Delhi High Court today transferred to the CBI from the police the investigation into the disappearance of AIVI student Najeeb Ahmad, who is missing since October 15, 2016. A bench of Justices G S Sistani and Rekha Palli transferred the matter to CBI with immediate effect on a plea by the student's mother after the Delhi Police said it has no problem with such a direction. The court said the probe by the CBI would be supervised by an officer not less than the rank of a DIG. in the posh Worli area in south Mumbai, agency sources said. Both Peter and his wife Indrani Mukerjea, found-ers of INX Media, are accused in the sensational ers of INX Media, are accused in the sensational Sheena Bora murder case and are lodged in jail here. The CBI has been conducting searches at 17 locations across the country, including New Delhi, Gurgaon, Chennai and Chidambaram's hometown of Karaikudi, as part of a probe into the alleged criminal misconduct in approval of foreign investments in India.(PTI)

Speaking about the various "positive" legislations brought in by the depart-ment affer the NDA govern-ment came to power. Dattatreya expressed hope that the new wage and in-dustrial relations codes will be passed in the Parliament's next session. "I am confident that we will bring this wage, industrial relation codes to the parliament in the next session and get it passed. It will benefit la-bourers and the working class," the minister said. He said there were 44 central la-bour laws. "We are going amalgamate all these labour laws and rationalise it into four labour codes- wages, industrial relations, social se-curity and safety, health and

working conditions," the working conditions," the minister said. He also an-nounced that a 200-bed ESI hospital will be set up at Bommasandra in Bengaluru at a cost of Rs 150 crore, and 100-bed hospitals will be set up in Shivamogga, Narasapura, Harohalli and Ballari. The 50-bed hospi-tals at Hubballi and Davangere will be upgraded to 100 beds, Dattatreya said. (PTI)

India hopes for sovereign, independent, united Palestine: Modi

NEW DELHI, MAY 16 /--/ Prime minister Narendra Modi today assured Pales-tine President Mahmoud Abbas of India's "unwaver-ing support" to the Palestin-ian cause, saying it hopes to an cause, saying it nopes to see a sovereign, united and an independent Palestine, co-existing peacefully with Israel. Modi, who is scheduled to travel to Israel in July, also hoped for early resumption of talks be-tween Palestinian and Israeli sides to move toward finding a comprehensive resolution. After extensive and wide-ranging talks be-tween Modi and Abbas, the two sides signed five agree-ments. Addressing a joint press event with Abbas, the nts. Addressing a iss event with Abbas ne minister said,

hope to see the realisation of a sovereign, independ-ent, united and viable Palestine, co-existing peace-fully with Israel. I have re-affirmed our position on this to President Abbas this to President Abbas during our conversation to-day." Modi also added that "India has been unwavering in supporting the Palestinian cause. India hopes for early resumption of talks between Palestinian and Israeli side to move to-wards finding a comprehensive resolution." Modi's remarks come ahead of his remarks come ahead of his scheduled visit to the Jew-ish state and assume sig-nificance in the backdrop of growing proximity be-tween India and Israel. Modi will be the first Indian Prime Minister to visit Israel. On his part, Abbas said Palestine ap-preciates the solidarity India extends to its cause. "In-dia is a friend. It has influence at the international level. India can play an im-portant role (in the resolv-ing Palestine Israel crisis," Abbas said. He also said Abbas said. He also said that he recently had meetings with US President Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin and discussed possibilities of an early resolution to the long-pending tion to the long-pending dispute with a two-state so-lution. Modi also noted that he and the visiting dig-nitary had an extensive ex-change of views on West Asia and the Middle East

Law panel to go slow on common code; awaits SC verdict on triple talag

NEW DELHI, MAY 16 /--/ The Law Commission has decided to "go slow" on its report on the uniform civil code as it will await the Supreme Court verdict on triple talaq, highly-placed sources in the panel said today. The law panel, which placed sources in the panel said today The lay panel, which advises the government on complex legal issues, has decided to await the verdict of the constitution bench of the apex court before involving various stakeholders for discussion to complete its report on the common code. The Supreme Court is likely to explain what personal law is. It is also likely to delve into the issue of religious fait and religious practice. Till the time the judgment is out, we have decided to go slow on the report on civil code, "the source said. The Commission believes that the verdict will provide guideline to the panel in drafting list report." Once the roadmap isset, wewillstart consultations with stakeholders, "the source said. The apex court had yesterday made it clear that it will keep open for adjudication in the future the issues of polygamy and nikah halala' among Muslims. A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice J S Khehar had said, "It may not be possible to deal with all the three issues in stitution bench headed by Chief Justice JS Khehar had said. "It may not be possible to deal with all the three issues in the limited time we have. We will keep them pending for future." The apex court has also said that it will only deal with the issue of triple talaq that too if it was fundamental tolslam. Indicating need for wilder consultation before taking a call on a uniform civil code, the government had in June last asked the Law Commission to examine the issue. Implementation of a common code is part of the BJP's election manifesto. Some Muslim leaders have opposed any move to abolish triple talaq and other personal laws.(PTI)

Govt not to allow any new BEd college this year

NEW DELHI, MAY 16 /--/ Concerned over the quality of the teacher training institutions, the Centre has decided that no new BEd college will be allowed in the country this year. Union HRD minister Prakash Javadekar observed to-day that BEd colleges were opening like "fly by night operators" until now. "You pay today and get the degree tomorrow." With the enhanced focus on the teacher training, all this need to be stopped. So it was decided no new BEd colleges will open in the country," he told reporters here. He said as far as opening of new colleges is concerned it will be a 'zero-year' and also existing colleges will have to undergo a quality audit. "We have asked for quality affidavits and so far only 7,000 of them have submitted. We have also issued show-cause notices to nearly 4,000 EEd colleges," he added. The government has also decided to increase the practical component in the Bachelor of Education (BEd) and Diploma in Education (DEd) courses. "The practical component will be increased in the teacher training modand Diploma in Euclation (Deap Component will be increased in the teacher training mod-ules and practical sessions will be conducted in govern-ment schools which will be under observation of the teach-ers there and student feedback will also be given impor-tance, "Javadekar said, CPTI)
